Dear Parents/Carers,

We are very pleased for Miss Rowlands, who is moving on to excellent opportunity at another school (I'm sure we will still see her around school) and we'll see Mrs Taylor as she will continue her role in Base 4.

Our Learning

Our Learning Journey for this term is based on Roald Dahl's 'Matilda'. Alongside this text we will be utilising a range of other quality texts to support our writing. Our overarching theme in school for the Spring term is Where would we be without books? Therefore, we will be exploring a wide range of different books alongside learning about the Great Fire of London and Nantwich. Please see the termly plan for an overview of some of the learning we will undertake. If you feel you can contribute towards our Learning Journey in any way (artefacts / books / photos, support in class with a particular skill etc.) it would be warmly welcomed.

Expectations

My expectations remain as high as they did last term for the children; they need to continue to develop their independence and responsibility for their own learning. I will challenge and support your child in their learning, but will expect your child to do their very best and contribute positively to our class so that we all have a very rewarding and successful year. It is really important that we work together to help your child succeed both personally and academically.

Arrival at school

We want 100% attendance in Base 2! Good attendance is necessary for good progress. Please ensure your child arrives between 8:45 and 8:55am ready to start the day. Morning activities (Maths and Literacy based), which consolidate or challenge the children's learning, are set up for this time in readiness for registration of the class by 9am and a smooth transition into the literacy lesson.

Monies and messages

All monies and messages **MUST** come into school with your child and be placed in the plastic wallet to assist Mrs Rowlands in the office at the start of the day. **It is important for the children to bring monies and messages in for themselves to help them become responsible and independent.**

Outdoor clothing

As the weather is much colder at the moment, please ensure appropriate clothing is in school; in particular, a warm/waterproof **coat** should be brought/worn to school every day.

Snack

Snack will be available for Mrs Warner at break times each day, but if your child wants to bring a snack from home please ensure that it is a <u>healthy snack</u> as we are promoting healthy living.

Base 2 Timetable

Our timetable will remain the same for this term, however we have an excellent opportunity this term of Cricket coaching from Cheshire Cricket coaches, which will take place on Monday afternoons.

PΕ

PE kits (red top, black shorts/trousers, trainers, jumper – all labelled please) must be in school on a Monday and Friday for our PE lessons. PE kits should then be taken home to be washed over the weekend and brought back into school on Monday. There may be opportunities during our Learning Journey lessons for additional PE sessions so **PE kits need to be in school all week.** The children will be reminded that it is their responsibility to make sure PE kits are in school. PE lessons will be outdoors and indoors.

Homework

This term homework will be slightly different; the type of homework will alternate each week. Maths one week followed by a literacy based task the following week. There may occasionally be project based homework sent home, which will be set over a two-week period. It is important for children to complete homework as it all contributes to their overall learning.

• Times Tables – every day

To be practised at least 5 times throughout the week before the test.

• Spellings -Test day Thursday

To be practised 5 times throughout the week before the test.

Daily Reading

Reading should be done daily, for at least 15 minutes, with comments written in the reading record.

Open door

My door is always open and I am always very happy to help should you have any concerns, wish to share information that is relevant to your child's well-being or require additional information regarding your child and their learning or progress. I will be on the door every morning or you can arrange a time to meet with me at a time that is convenient for the both of us.

I am very much looking forward to another fantastic term with Base 2 and learning about our exciting new topic.
