

Our Literacy this term will be led by our class text, Paddington Bear, Michael Bond alongside other texts to enhance our learning which will all be based around our overarching theme, Around the World.

This term in Literacy we will continue to cover a wide range of genres of writing, including poetry, instructional writing, diaries, recount, explanations and a range of narratives. We will be securing all of the skills we have learnt to make our writing the best it can be. We will be using our editing skills to check our spelling and punctuation and improve our sentences. Within each piece of writing we will be exploring alternative vocabulary to make our writing exciting and interesting. Our reading this term will take us across a wide range of texts to help increase our reading speed, fluency and understanding of the texts. A range of activities will be used to develop word reading and comprehension with a focus on inference and predicting.

Computing

In computing this term we will be using Barefoot computing to explore world maps and create our own with links made to South America. We will develop our understanding of how to use the internet safely but purposefully for different things.

Geography

Our Geography this term will take us to South America with a focus on Peru where Paddington Bear came from. We will be using maps to locate Peru and other countries in South America. We will find out more about Peru including the population, mountain ranges and the Amazon Rainforest.

History

'I was brought up by my Aunt Lucy in Darkest Peru.' In History this term we will be exploring Peru's history focusing on Machu Picchu and the Inca Empire. We will develop an understanding of the significance of the Inca Empire for Peru.

Maths

We will be building on top of our previously learnt skills and will continue to work on the basic skills that will allow us to progress through maths. To do this we will be focusing more on the reasoning and problem solving aspect of Maths. We will be continuously recapping our learning from number and place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. We will also work on time and measurement, working through fluency, reasoning and problem solving aspects of each concept. Within Maths, to secure concepts, we will use the concrete (practical resources), pictorial (use of pictures) and abstract (without resources or pictures) approach.
