**OUR STORY - A LOCAL CHARITY WITH A NATIONAL REACH**

In 1988, thanks to the dedication of 8 local families, the Wingate Centre opened, offering gymnastics classes to local disabled children and over the years we had considerable success at the Special Olympics. One of our brightest stars, Olympic Silver Medalist at Rio 2016 Bryony Page, trained at our mainstream trampolining classes and remains a great ambassador for the Centre in her role as Vice President of our Charity. In 2000 we expanded our services and opened our Holiday Centre which has so far welcomed over 10,000 visitors.
