Music

PE

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Science

English

This term, we will focus on life on the farm, reading a range of different stories based on farms and writing from characters' perspectives, retelling stories and producing non-fiction texts about farm life.

Like Charlotte, we will be focussing on our letter formation and handwriting (using pencils, rather than spiders' silk), doing lots of reading activities to expand our vocabulary and help improve our reading and writing skills.

Geography

"Secrets are hard to keep. Long before Sunday came, the news spread all over the county"

Our Geography work will focus on knowledge of UK locations. We will explore the different types of farming which takes place in different regions in the UK, whilst learning the names of some different counties and cities, using points of the compass to describe their location.

We will also link in some of our History focus to compare farming and land use in the UK with modern day and ancient Egypt.

History

We will use our farming focus to explore the farming methods of Ancient Egypt and compare the methods, seasons and animals they kept with modern day farming in the UK and Egypt.

Computing

Design and Technology
