READY, STEADY, READ... Friday 15th – Friday 22nd February

You should all have received a letter and **Sponsored Read** form by now. An assembly was led by Jane Dickinson (Usborne Books representative) on Tuesday to launch our **Sponsored Read** as we lead up to our **Reading Week** starting on Monday 4th March. We are supporting the idea of Sponsored Read because:

- 1) All the money raised will go to buy new and exciting reading books for the children across school.
- 2) We want to enhance the range of books we offer and can do this with the additional 60% of the money raised donated by Usborne for extra books.
- 3) Your child will receive *a voucher* valued at half the money they have raised to put towards a book of their choice from Usborne Books.
- 4) We value reading.
- 5) We know that giving quality time daily to read can hook a child in to books and a love of reading for pleasure, which is a wonderful hobby, and will support their all-round learning in so many ways.
- 6) It can give parents/carers and children *quality*, *quiet*, *shared time together* there is nothing better than sitting with a book (magazine, recipe, menu, information book...) and talking about the pictures, talking about a story or something interesting in a factual book, reading to a child or listening to a child read.

Thursday 7th March is World Book Day and we will all be dressing up as story characters for the day. It would be great if as many children as possible could take part and dress up too. We are hosting an Usborne Book Fair which will be open to parents from 2.45pm in the school hall.

Teaching and Learning

This last half term has seen some wonderful learning taking place through our whole school theme of water; from life size penguins and polar bears in Little Wrens and Base 1... to shells and sea creatures in Base 2... to the river bank with Base 3... to the local canal with Base 4 ... to the impact on global warming / climate change on sea levels in Base 5. A rich range of knowledge and understanding flowing through school!

For KS 2, the term began with a **theatre visit** to see The Wind in the Willows – a classic tale based on the river bank and the story that has lead Base 3's learning journey this term. Alongside this there has been some fantastic **'field work'** and **local study** work undertaken by Base 4 and Base 5:

Base 4 explored a stretch of very own canal in Wrenbury this week and learned lots of amazing facts with the fantastic support of Heather's mum, Elizabeth Hand, who was able to tell the children some of the history of the Llangollen Canal in Wrenbury and demonstrated how the cantilever road bridge opens to let narrow boats pass. We also thank Mal Edwards MBE, a traditional fender maker, for sharing his trade and information about his narrowboat with the children during the morning.

Base 5 travelled further afield to Carding Mill Valley near Church Stretton for a fantastic day exploring and measuring the river, investigating its wildlife and the natural landscape. A cold but fascinating day of high quality, first-hand learning was enjoyed by all.

Base 3 had a great morning on Tuesday. Mr Butterill, former mayor of Crewe and Nantwich, came in to teach children how to make bird boxes and to understand their importance. I was invited to watch Miss McKinnon put one up in the school grounds to the delight of the children! Thank you Base 3 for supporting our wonderful wildlife!
