Choice of clubs available; sporting opportunities for Y3	We endeavour to put on a range of clubs across the year. We have limited indoor space (OOSC in hall). Some clubs need space and are good weather dependent. We tend to do these clubs in the summer term or provide clubs at lunch time. Staff have surveyed children about their interests and what they want to learn more about. Wellbeing Lunch Clubs in the summer term have been planned to focus around the children's interests. Children are going to be put into a WBLC with children who share their interest and WBLC will be activity based. Encouragement and praise for work 'well done', for the effort a child has put into their work or for a child demonstrating learing to be a learner are given in many ways in school: a thumbs up, a sticker, a house point/team point/marble or counter in the team jar; a verbal 'well-done'/ 'I really liked', a HT Award, a Star Learner Award, a Star Reader Award; an ACHIEVE Award for demonstrating learning to be a learner skills and application.	We will talk again with the children about how praise and encouragement are given for very good work, effort and learning to be a learner – all of which are celebrated in our Friday afternoon assemblies. More information on social interactions in school.	We provide this type of information at our termly parent evenings (next one is the end of this term). With the daily 'meet and greet' at the start and end of the day, as well as our openness to meet parents as soon as a concern is raised, we feel parents are able to discuss this with the class teacher at any time across the school year. The discussion may be in person or by phone, if more convenient. Class newsletters always reiterate that the parent/carer should not hesitate to contact school with any concern.
