• Children in Y5 and Y6 can walk to and from school but school MUST be informed prior to the start of this arrangement.

Expectations of parents

Ensure your child:

• **arrives to school on time** (no later than 8.55am in class) and is picked up at 3.30pm. Please do not be on site earlier than 8.40am as there is no school supervision and sometimes we have emergency contractors /waste collection vehicles on site. Equally do not be late for pick up.

- has a named **name labelled**, water bottle this will be sent home daily, to be cleaned, refilled with water only and returned. Please encourage your child to drink water and avoid juices.
- wears **correct school uniform** daily (including <u>plain</u> grey, white, black socks or <u>plain</u> red, white, black, • grey tights – please keep 'fun' socks for theme days/ own clothes days / 'odd socks' days)
- comes to school in correct PE Kit and footwear on their PE day •
- wears **no jewellery/accessories** only stud earrings, if worn, and **longer hair is tied back** • (hairband/bobbles)
- has sun-cream applied BEFORE school, if needed, and brings a sun hat, if very hot and sunny •
- brings a **coat** if weather forecast is for an overcast, rainy day or cold weather •
- brings a SMALL school bag and NO personal belongings/toys from home.
- is supported at home with their learning as much as possible if this is a difficulty, please do share with your child's teacher
- engages in **lots of talk with an adult** to increase their spoken vocabulary, word knowledge and confidence in expressing an opinion, idea, observation
- has time limited play on 'devices' (tablets, phones, PlayStation/Xbox); check suitability of online • games/apps (age appropriate) and privacy settings, and supervise your child to keep your child safe from online risk and harm.

Ensure your child's

- attendance is the best that it can be. It will be closely monitored and children are expected to attend all sessions that school is open. We follow government guidelines regarding non-attendance. Note: late codes in register contribute to 'absence' record.
- Keep all contact details and telephone numbers up to date with office admin so that you can be • contacted quickly in case of an emergency. At least two contacts are needed. If personal circumstances change, please do let us know so that we can support your child if it is needed.

Illness and absence

- For most sniffles, coughs and colds children should be in school a children's paracetamol (eg Calpol) should be given before school and once signed in the office can be administered in school. We will always send a child home if they are too unwell for school.
- If your child is on antibiotics for an illness that is not contagious and is well enough for school, again this • can be administered in school once the paperwork has been signed / authorised with school – office.
- If your child suffers from asthma an asthma plan **must** be completed, and a copy should be in school. An inhaler **must** be always in school if you identify your child as asthmatic, even if an inhaler is only occasionally used. The inhaler must be 'in date'.
- If your child has a sickness bug/diarrhoea, they should not return until 48 hours after their last bout. •

Expectations of Staff

- uphold the school's ethos - 'We all matter' - and ensure your child (and your family) matters to us
- support a positive parent partnership to enable us to work together in the best interest of your child •
- endeavour to provide the best education and enrichment opportunities we can so that your child makes • at least good progress from their individual starting point, meets their potential and has a well-rounded experience in readiness for the next stage of their learning journey
- support your child's wellbeing, safety and happiness in and out of school •
- keep you up to date with your child's learning: termly newsletters, learning journey overviews, parent evenings, sharing afternoons, annual reports, information sharing sessions/workshops, website news
