Base 5: Zach for noticing when someone needs help.

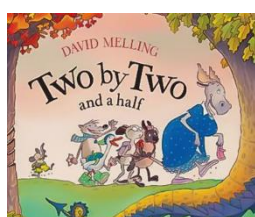
ACHIEVE Learning Awards:

We know, when children use these skills well they accomplish great things. We will be focusing on one element of our ACHIEVE behaviours each week as part of our assembly.

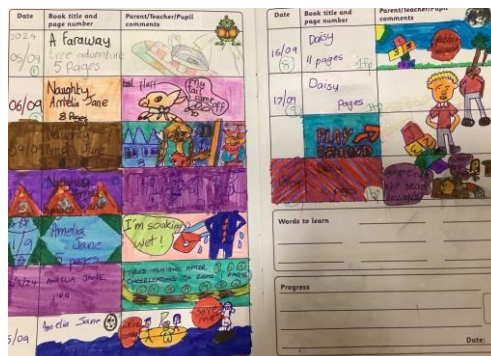
