Reading awards:

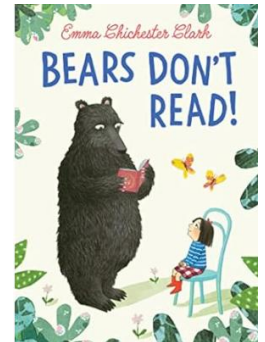
