# School Roof Replacement – beginning 29/3/25

The roof works are beginning this weekend. Please be aware that there will be a range of specialists on site during school hours, at weekends and during the holidays. All workers will have identifying badges or paperwork. The adjustments we are making are crucial to ensure the safety of everyone involved and to help the project run smoothly.

#### **Key Changes:**

- No Access via Front Pedestrian Gates: Starting Monday, 31st March, the pedestrian gates on the main
  road will be closed. All access to the school during normal drop-off and pick-ups will be via the MUGA
  gate only.
- There will be no public access to the back gate (on the playground) during this time.
- Base 4 and 5 are to enter the school through the main reception.
- Base 2 will enter through the Base 3 classroom.
- Access During the School Day: If you need to access the school during school hours, you can do so
  through the school car park. One gate will remain open for this purpose. Please take due care if using this
  route.
- The Nest: For morning sessions, all children should come to school via the MUGA gate. For afternoon pick-ups (after 4pm), please enter via the school car park- again, please take care here.
- After-School Clubs: Please collect your child(ren) from the school via the car park at the end of afterschool clubs.

Communication: Where possible, we kindly ask that you send messages to the school office via email or phone call to help us manage inquiries efficiently.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work to improve the school's facilities. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact the school office.
