Attendance - reminder

Attendance remains a key priority at Wrenbury. The impact of non-attendance on our children is significant and because of this attendance is also a national priority. Non-attendance not only impacts learning but also has a negative impact on friendships and that sense of belonging that is so important to our young people. Even though we strive for it, we recognise that it can be a challenge to get 100% every year therefore we will be awarding 100% attendance stickers on a weekly basis.

Please familiarise yourself with the school's Attendance Policy on the school website so that you don't fall foul of potential Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) and fines.

Medication

The office can administer medication if your child requires any during school hours. If your child is bringing medication into school, a medication consent form **must be** completed, and any medication handed into the office. We kindly request that you bring your own Calpol if required. We do hold a small supply but only in case of emergencies.

Please check your child's medical and dietary needs in Arbor and update them if necessary. Any child who suffers with asthma will be contacted by the office during the first week to ensure their asthma care plan is up to date.


And finally...
