Base 2: Mable for showing value in all lessons.


Base 3: Stanley- for improving his effort and resilience to challenges.

Online Safety

Thank you to those parents who attended the Online Safety information evening by DC Andy. In today's times it is essential that parents know the risks that smart phones and modern technology hold for our children. We will be holding another session later in year and do expect all parents to attend.

There were a few key tips that I would like to share with you. Firstly, a website: Keep Children Safe Online: Information, advice, support - Internet Matters This website helps parents keep safe online, showing you which settings are needed for different websites/ apps as well as giving lots of handy hits and tips to help you navigate the digital world that our children are in.

DC Andy also recommended the installation of an app called 'ReThink' ReThink - Before the Damage is Done which supports children, when needed, to re-think about the content of their messages before they send them. When this app is used, 98% of uses changed their messages when they reminded about being kind online.
