An exhibition by local artist Nicholas Ferenczy

Paintings, drawings & prints by Nantwich-based artist, Nicholas Ferenczy explores the collisions of image and text. Many make use of figures – one of the artist's ongoing interests. Following on from Nicholas's involvement as an in-house writer and editor on popular magazines (such as *The Horrible Histories Collection*), some pieces use text (as speech bubbles/thought bubbles/captions) combined with painted images – often for comic effect. Says Nicholas: "This is real – that's to say, authentic – art. It is not mass-produced for commercial galleries. I hope you can spot the difference!"

Evening Class- A County Destroyed by the Civil War – the Civil War in Cheshire

This is a ten week evening class running at the museum from September - December 2017 considering the Civil War conflict with particular reference to this locality.
