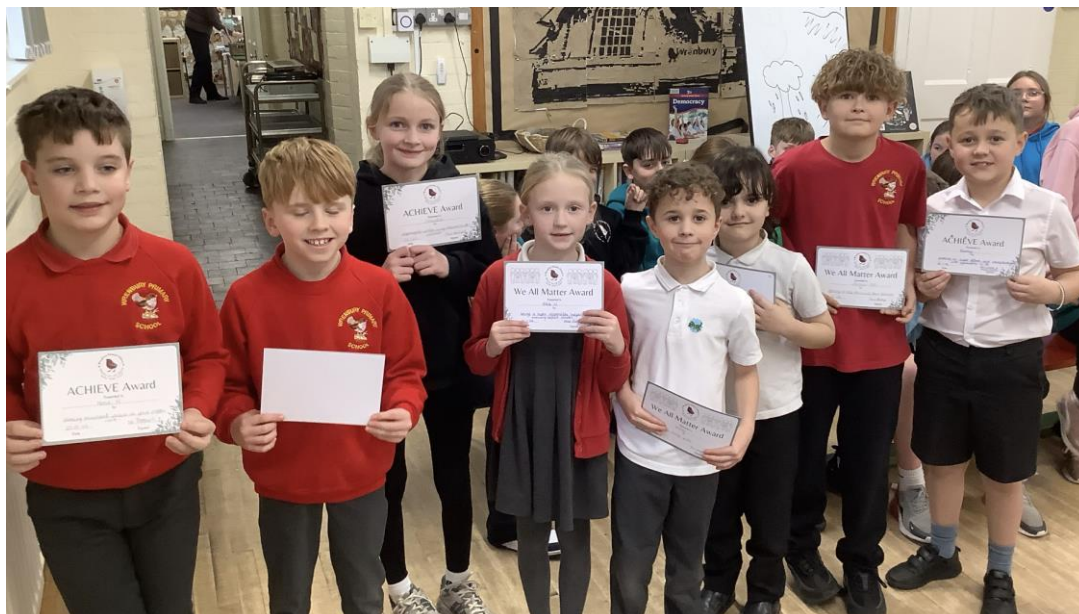
This week's awards...

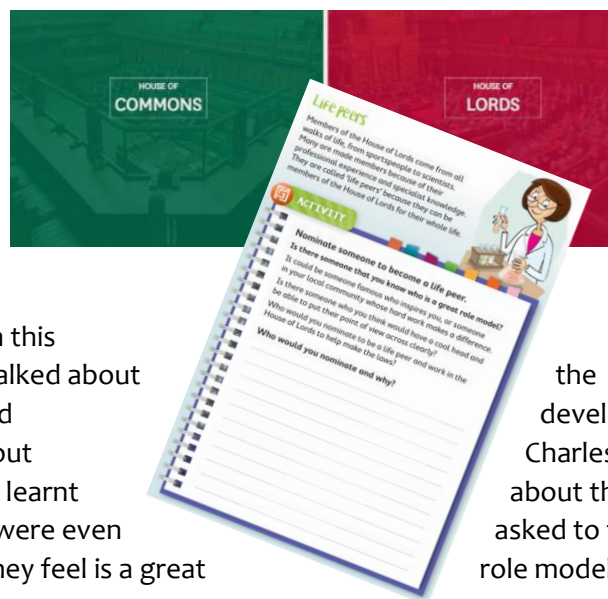


This week, 111 children achieved their 100% attendance award sticker- well done!
