Well, we have had a busy old week at Wrenbury Primary School! Our Little Wrens have been out and about working on their gross motor skills this week, using the bikes and balls to strengthen core muscles. In Base 1 this week, the children have enjoyed making volcanoes with the large blocks outside. They have then used this landscape to create an exciting world for their dinosaurs. Base 2 have been exploring musical instruments; listening to the sounds that they create and then linking these to places in the village- their theme focus. They have also been using the skills learnt in their art printing lessons bubble printing Valentine's Day cards. Base 3 have blown me away with their diary writing; writing as Mole from *The Wind in the Willows*. Gold badges go to: Stirling and Nancy.




This week, 107 children achieved their 100% attendance award sticker- well done!
