Curriculum Assembly :

This week we had a maths subject assembly where we focused on mathematical problem solving and how mathematicians think when faced with a tricky challenge. We explored the story of *The 17 Camels*, where three brothers had to divide their father's camels according to unusual fractions. At first the problem seemed impossible, but with the help of a wise villager they discovered that sometimes problems can be solved by looking at them in a different way and thinking creatively.

The story helped pupils understand that in maths it is not just about getting the answer quickly, but about trying strategies, thinking carefully, learning from mistakes and explaining your reasoning. The children discussed how mathematicians stay curious, keep trying when something feels difficult and work together to solve problems.
