Base 4 Theme Day:

What an incredible Theme Day we have had as we stepped back in time to explore the fascinating Maya civilisation. The day began with a whole-school assembly where children confidently shared their learning about Maya life, food and traditions. Throughout the day, they immersed themselves in hands-on experiences, preparing and tasting Maya-inspired foods such as tortillas and bean dishes, before creating their own clay cooking pots using coiling techniques and traditional patterns. In the afternoon, Base 4 took their learning outside for a Maya-themed orienteering challenge, where they worked in teams to decode ancient number systems using dots, bars and shells. The children absolutely loved the orienteering course and fully embraced the active, engaging learning. It was a fantastic day that brought together history, maths, art, design technology and oracy, and we are incredibly proud of the children's enthusiasm, creativity and confidence.
