**Base 1 Theme Day:**

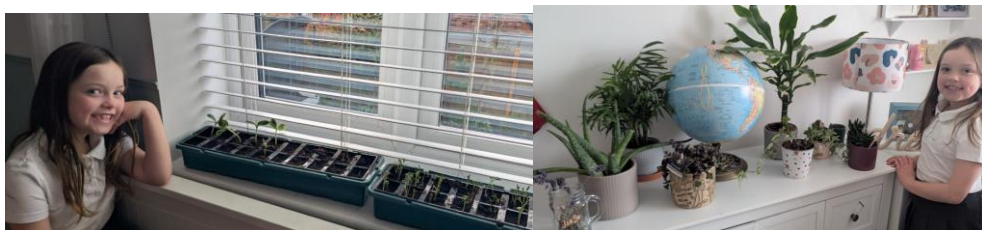
