This week, the children enjoyed learning all about World Earth Day, exploring our wonderful planet and discussing how we can care for and protect it. Our Little Wrens put their learning into action during Welly Wednesday, when they took part in a litter pick around the grounds. They showed great teamwork and enthusiasm, demonstrating a real sense of responsibility for their environment.

In Base 2, the children have begun their new learning in art, focusing on birds, with a particular emphasis on the Wren. They have been observing shapes, patterns and details, leading to thoughtful discussion and creativity as they begin to develop their own artwork. Meanwhile, Base 3 have been combining their learning in maths and computing by collecting data and using technology to help present their findings, developing both their analytical skills and confidence with digital tools. Base 5 have been very busy learning about how people around the world protect themselves from natural disasters and have started to create a game on J2Code, Visual using more complex algorithms.



The children have also been working hard during lunchtime maypole practices in preparation for upcoming celebrations — not always an easy task in the windy weather, but their perseverance and teamwork have been wonderful to see. Our Gardening Club have been equally busy, planting, watering and generally tidying up our outdoor areas. A big well done to everyone involved for taking such pride in our school environment.

We have also been making the most of the sunny weather, with the children thoroughly enjoying our fabulous outdoor space during playtimes and PE sessions. Fresh air and physical activity have added to the children's energy and enjoyment this week, supporting both their wellbeing and enthusiasm for learning.
