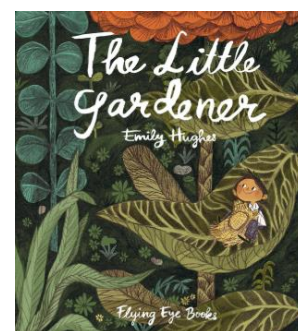


Assemblies:

On Monday, the whole school were delighted to welcome our newest *Mystery Musician*, Mr Robinson, who treated us to a wonderful piano performance. The children are thoroughly enjoying listening to a broad range of music and discovering different instruments, and it has been lovely to see their curiosity and enthusiasm grow. In assembly this week, we revisited '**value**', one of our *Achieve* behaviours. We shared the story *The Little Gardener* – a lovely book about a tiny gardener who shows great value in his work by tending his garden with care and determination, even though he is too small to manage it all on his own. After working extremely hard, he becomes tired and falls asleep. While he rests, help arrives and together the garden is transformed into something beautiful.



We talked about how *valuing* our work means taking pride in what we do, aiming for high quality and recognising that our efforts matter. The story also reminded us that although we should always try our best, valuing our work doesn't mean working alone – we can accept help and support from others. During the assembly, some children were given sweet pea seedlings to nurture and help grow. These plants represented our learning and work in school: when we value our learning, care for it and give it time and effort, it can flourish. In doing so, we can feel proud of what we achieve.
