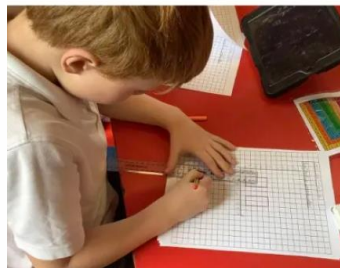


## Wrenbury Primary School Newsletter

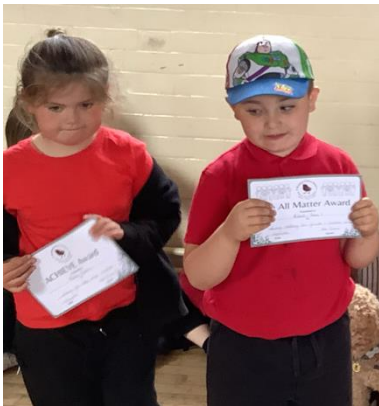
**This week's awards...**

## Celebrations

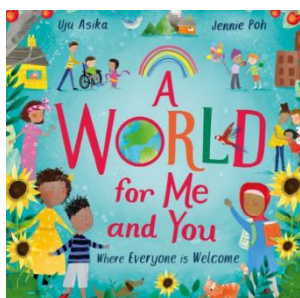
