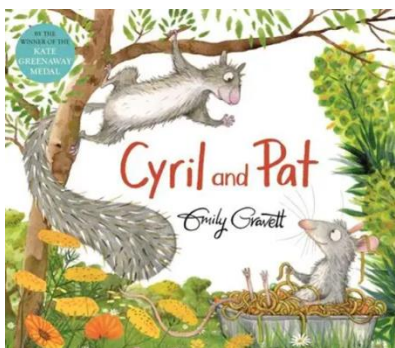
Celebrations

Base 4 Theme Day:

Our Base 4 Theme Day has been a fantastic opportunity for the children to explore the question: How do humans impact the environment? Throughout the day, the children became geographers and scientists as they investigated the local area around Wrenbury Village. In the morning, they carried out a traffic survey to collect data about the types of vehicles travelling through the



village before heading to the canal to collect water samples for testing. During the afternoon, the children presented and analysed their traffic survey findings before investigating the canal water further by testing pH levels and filtering the samples to determine how healthy the water was. The children showed excellent teamwork, enquiry skills and curiosity throughout the day, while developing a deeper understanding of the impact humans can have on the environment around us.



School Council:

Our lovely school council met with PC Sharon on Thursday to discuss road safety. Our school council members will be working with PC Sharon with the speed gun over the coming weeks to monitor traffic through the village. They are also planning to deliver a road safety lesson to our younger children.

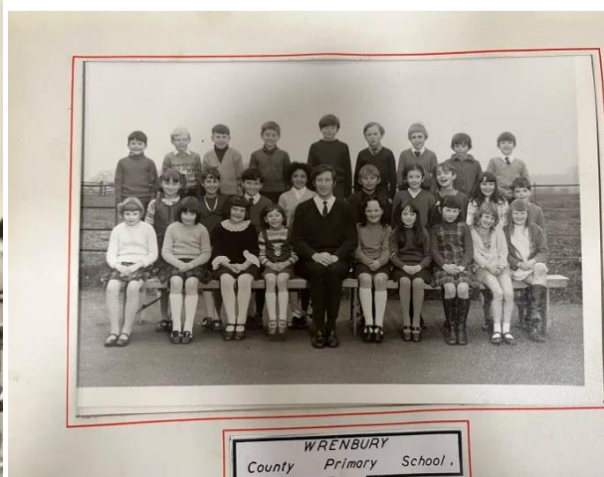


Base 3 – Miss Carter maternity leave

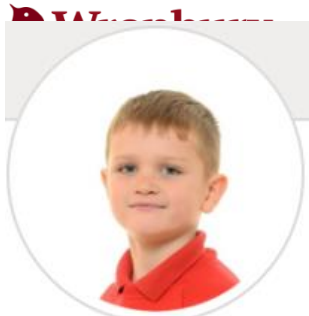
150 Years of Wrenbury School:
