Attendance – reminder

Attendance remains a key priority at Wrenbury. The impact of non-attendance on our children is significant and because of this attendance is also a national priority. Non-attendance not only impacts learning but also has a negative impact on friendships and that sense of belonging that is so important to our young people.

Please familiarise yourself with the school's Attendance Policy on the school website so that you don't fall foul of potential Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) and fines. Below is the FPN structure;

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave, or for unauthorised absence, the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence

within 3 years

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave, or unauthorised absence, the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence

and any further offences within 3 years

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave, or unauthorised absence a Penalty Notice will NOT be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines up to £2,500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
