In science, Year 2 have been investigating habitats and enjoyed taking their learning outdoors to look at the habitats around school. Base 2 have been listening to World Cup songs throughout the years. Using a current world event to inspire their topic of the World. Base 3 and Base 5 has a real treat with Mrs Cador visiting to start work on some 150 year celebratory art work – these really are looking great. Base 3 were inspired by a photo that was kindly given to school which shows the gardening club of 1910- many of the young boys on the photo went off to fight in WW1 – this really has humbled all who have seen it.
