This week, 113 children achieved their 100% attendance award sticker- well done!

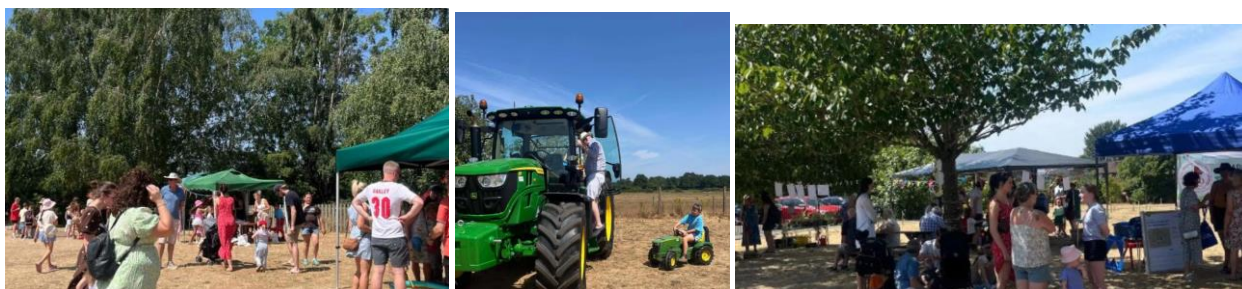
