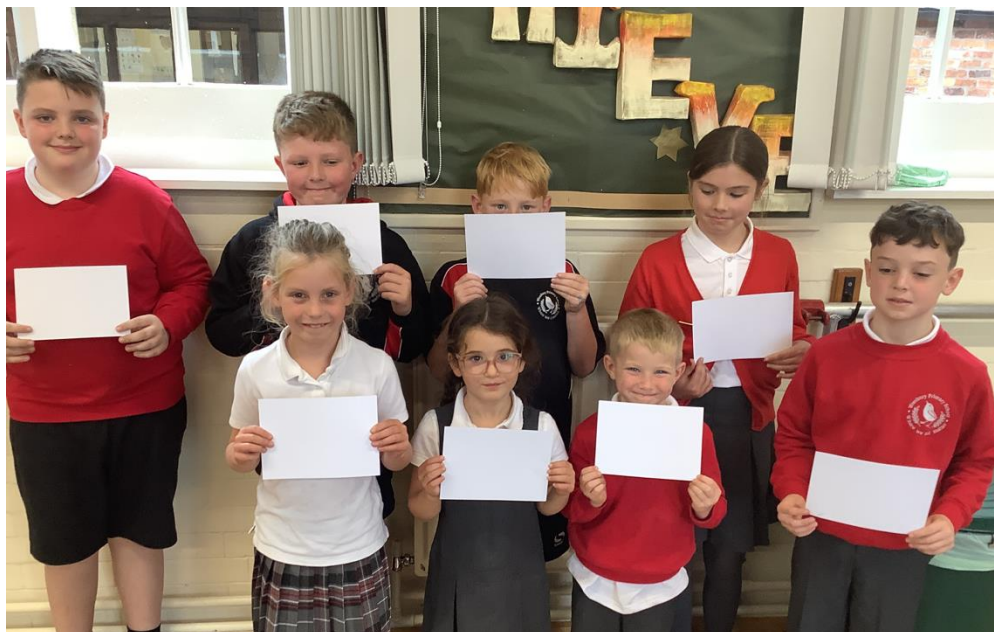
This week's awards...

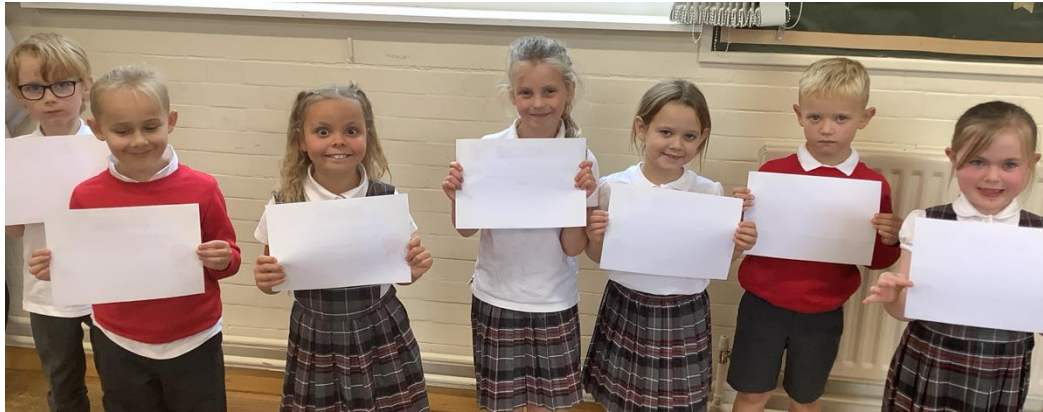
We are super proud of seven children from last year's Base 2 whose drawings have been selected for publication in the Young Writers' Super Me colouring book!
