- Base 5:** Jack for independently collecting resources to help himself in maths.



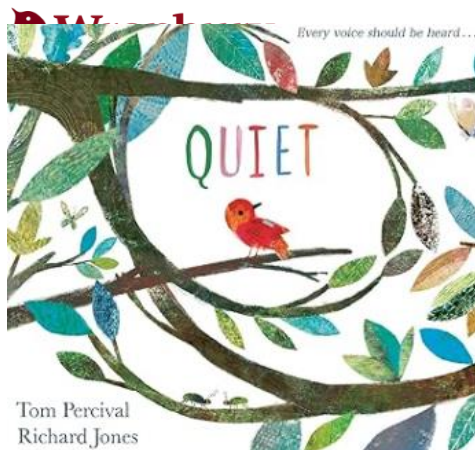
This week, 115 pupils achieved their **100% attendance** award sticker- well done! Every day at school matters both educationally and socially. Keep up the hard work everyone!
