History Assembly:

This week our curriculum assembly focused on history. We learnt that, 220 years ago, on the 21st October 1805,



Lord Nelson's fleet faced Napolean near Cape Trafalgar -one of the most famous naval battles in our history. Nelson divided his ships into two lines and cut through the enemy fleet, surprising them and securing victory!

We learnt Nelson's famous words: "England expects that every man will do his duty." and were impressed at the skill shown in the battle. Sadly, Lord Nelson died on his ship before he was told he had won the battle. We looked at the monument in Trafalgar Square in

London, where his courage is remembered forever.
