They were so kind and went over and above to welcome us. This week Base 3 have been busy creating beautiful work, putting their art work into their Learning Journey books. Linking to their class text *The 1,000-Year-Old Boy*, they re-created the dramatic fire in the woods as a news report, taking on roles like anchors, reporters and eyewitnesses. They worked on using expression, eye contact and clear voices to bring the scene to life, showing how strong oracy skills can help them understand the story better and share their ideas just like real reporters.
